## SESSION FOR TEACHERS ON MLA FORMAT AND CITATIONS ALIGNED WITH IB PHILOSOPHY



This session focused on equipping teachers with a clear understanding of the MLA citation format, emphasizing its role in fostering academic honesty and effective research skills in alignment with the IB philosophy. Teachers were guided through the essential components of **MLA citations, including books, journals, online sources, interviews, and multimedia.** 

Practical examples were provided to ensure a hands-on learning experience, enabling educators to confidently guide students in creating accurate and consistent citations.

Teachers were encouraged to **engage in collaborative activities** and discussions, fostering an environment of shared learning. The resources and examples provided during the session empower teachers to implement citation practices effectively, **making academic honesty a natural part of students' learning journey.** 





# Orientation in Space and Time

For their first unit, the **students in MYP2 English Class** explored the evolution of gender roles in fairy tales by reading various versions written by different authors. The focus was on understanding **how gender portrayals have changed over time in response to shifting societal perspectives.** This inquiry was framed within the global context of "Orientation in Space and Time," encouraging students to examine how both the context of time and place influence the evolution of stories and societal norms.

At the conclusion of the unit, students were tasked with comparing and contrasting traditional fairy tales with their modern remakes. The goal was to analyze how gender roles have evolved and how contemporary retellings reflect current societal attitudes.

This activity focused on **developing key ATL skills** like critical thinking, comprehension, making inferences and drawing conclusions.
