PEER LEARNING IN ACTION!




A big shoutout to our DP2 students for showing initiative, teamwork, and leadership while preparing for their final exams in May 2026!

MYP LEARNERS INDULGE IN INQUIRY AND INNOVATION IN PONDICHERRY

As part of their experiential learning journey, our MYP learners recently embarked on an enriching **educational field trip to Pondicherry,** visiting three remarkable destinations — **Svaram Sound Garden, the Bamboo Centre, and the Auroville Matrimandir.** The trip provided a perfect opportunity for students to make meaningful, interdisciplinary connections beyond the classroom, in alignment with the IB philosophy of holistic and inquiry-based education.

At Svaram Sound Garden, students explored the fascinating **world of sound, vibration, and harmony,** engaging in hands-on experiences with unique musical instruments. This allowed them to apply their thinking and research skills, connecting scientific concepts with creativity and cultural expression.

The visit to the **Bamboo Centre** offered valuable insights into sustainable architecture and environmental innovation. **Students observed how bamboo, as a renewable material, can be used in design and construction** — a real-world application of their critical and analytical skills.

Finally, at the **Auroville Matrimandir**, learners had a reflective and serene experience, understanding the principles of mindfulness, community living, and sustainability. This setting encouraged them to practice self-management and reflective skills, while appreciating the balance between **inner and outer growth.**
